Jesse wants to increase the funds available to the Randolph school system. Not by raising Randolph taxes – but by getting the rest of Massachusetts to contribute to our fair share. Randolph schools have not gotten our fair share of state school funding for decades!

Randolph is the most diverse town in Massachusetts. The 1993 school funding formula tries to account for diversity, but has eroded for Randolph over the last 24 years.

Randolph also has not gotten our fair share of school capital funds, either. The Commonwealth allocates about \$500 million a year for construction – Newton High got \$200 million to build one mega-school, while Randolph High got only a few replacement windows. Let's fix that!

Randolph's schools rank poorly compared to our neighbors. Randolph's teachers and administrators are good, but they need more funding to catch up!

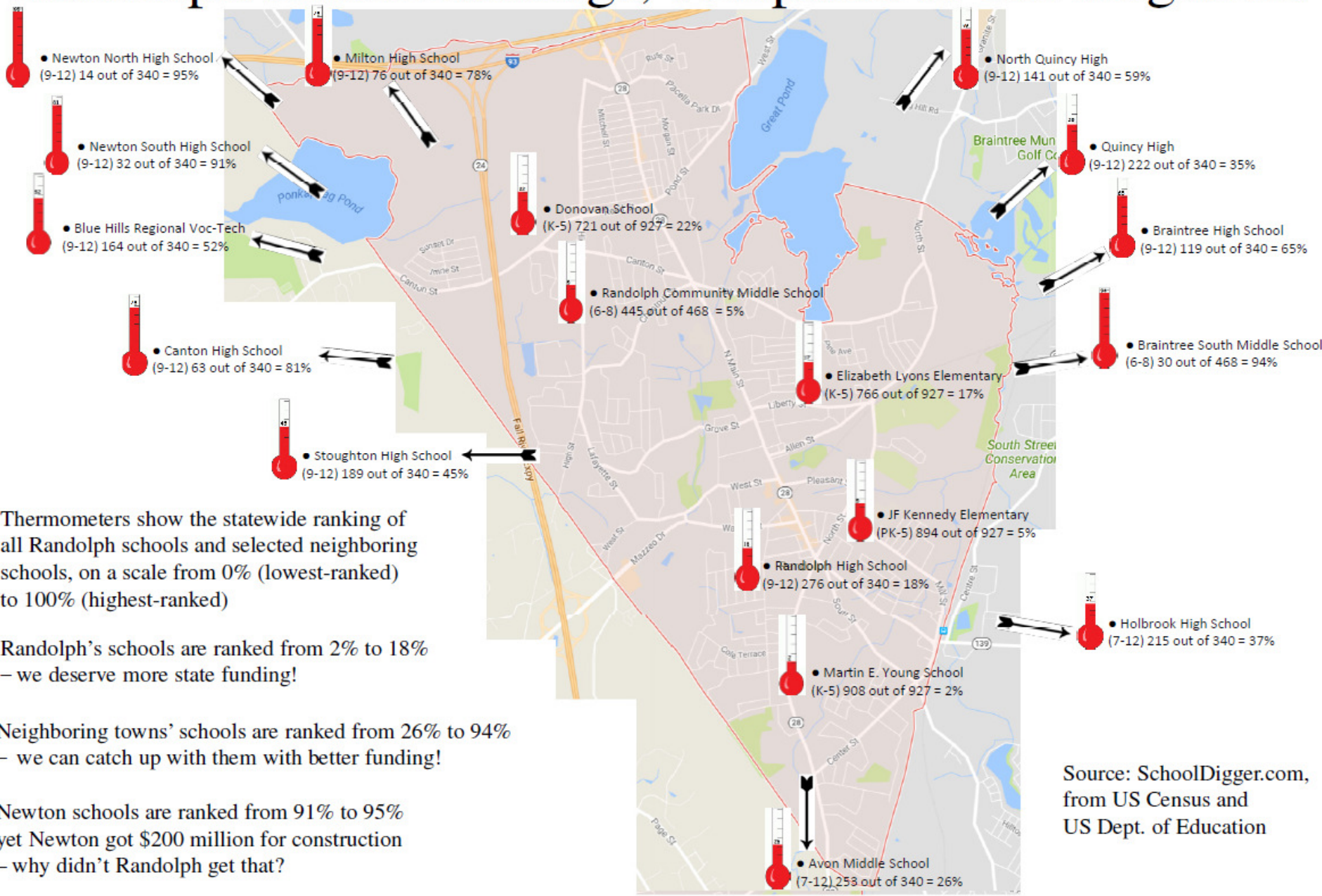

Randolph school rankings, compared to our neighbors



Thermometers show the statewide ranking of all Randolph schools and selected neighboring schools, on a scale from 0% (lowest-ranked) to 100% (highest-ranked)

Randolph's schools are ranked from 2% to 18%
 – we deserve more state funding!

Neighboring towns' schools are ranked from 26% to 94%
 – we can catch up with them with better funding!

Newton schools are ranked from 91% to 95%
 yet Newton got \$200 million for construction
 – why didn't Randolph get that?
